UNDERSTANDING THE PHRASE "I'M NOT A MUSICIAN I MAKE MUSIC INTERVIEW"

THE PHRASE "I'M NOT A MUSICIAN I MAKE MUSIC INTERVIEW" ENCAPSULATES A MINDSET EMBRACED BY MANY CONTEMPORARY ARTISTS AND PRODUCERS. THIS DISTINCTION IS CRUCIAL IN UNDERSTANDING HOW THE TERM "MUSICIAN" IS EVOLVING IN THE 21ST CENTURY, INFLUENCED BY NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND CHANGING CREATIVE PRACTICES.

DEFINING MUSICIANSHIP VS. MUSIC MAKING

TRADITIONALLY, MUSICIANSHIP HAS BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH PROFICIENCY IN INSTRUMENTS, THEORY, AND PERFORMANCE. FROM ANALOG INSTRUMENTS TO DIGITAL TOOLS

CHANGING ROLES IN MUSIC TEAMS

MODERN MUSIC PROJECTS FREQUENTLY INVOLVE DIVERSE ROLES SUCH AS BEATMAKERS, SOUND DESIGNERS, AND PROGRAMMERS. DAWs SUCH AS ABLETON LIVE, FL STUDIO, AND LOGIC PRO ARE CENTRAL TO MODERN MUSIC PRODUCTION. THEY PROVIDE A PLATFORM WHERE USERS CAN RECORD, EDIT, AND MIX SOUNDS WITH PRECISION. MANY PRODUCERS WHO CLAIM "I'M NOT A MUSICIAN I MAKE MUSIC INTERVIEW" RELY ON THESE TOOLS TO BRING THEIR MUSICAL IDEAS TO LIFE.

SAMPLING AND LOOPING

SAMPLING ALLOWS CREATORS TO INCORPORATE SNIPPETS OF EXISTING RECORDINGS INTO NEW COMPOSITIONS, WHILE LOOPING FACILITATES REPETITIVE MOTIFS WITHOUT LIVE PERFORMANCE. THESE TECHNIQUES EXPAND THE CREATIVE TOOLKIT BEYOND TRADITIONAL MUSICIANSHIP AND ARE COMMONLY DISCUSSED IN ARTIST INTERVIEWS.

INSIGHTS FROM INDUSTRY INTERVIEWS
