Answers to Geometry and Measurement

- A hexagon has 6 sides.
- Sum of interior angles of a triangle is 180 degrees.
- A square has 4 equal sides and 4 right angles.
- An angle measuring exactly 90 degrees is a right angle.

- A square is a type of rectangle because it has 4 right angles and opposite sides are equal.
- Perimeter of rectangle: $2 \times (8 \text{ cm} + 5 \text{ cm}) = 26 \text{ cm}$
- Area of square: $6 \text{ in} \times 6 \text{ in} = 36 \text{ square inches}$
- Volume of box: $4 \text{ cm} \times 3 \text{ cm} \times 2 \text{ cm} = 24 \text{ cubic centimeters}$
- Perimeter of garden: $2 \times (10 \text{ m} + 7 \text{ m}) = 34 \text{ meters}$
- Area of rectangle: $12 \text{ ft} \times 9 \text{ ft} = 108 \text{ square feet}$

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the sum of 345 and 678?

The sum of 345 and 678 is 1023.

If you have 24 apples and divide them equally among 6 friends, how many apples does each friend get?

Each friend gets 4 apples because 24 divided by 6 equals 4.

What is the area of a rectangle with length 8 cm and width 5 cm?

The area is 40 square centimeters ($8 \text{ cm} \times 5 \text{ cm} = 40 \text{ cm}^2$).

Solve: $9 \times 7 = ?$

9 multiplied by 7 equals 63.
