WHAT IS THE T4 TEST FOR DOGS?

WHEN SHOULD A DOG UNDERGO A T4 TEST?

VETERINARIANS RECOMMEND A T4 TEST FOR DOGS EXHIBITING SIGNS SUGGESTIVE OF THYROID DYSFUNCTION OR AS PART OF A COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH SCREENING. CERTAIN BREEDS ARE MORE PREDISPOSED TO THYROID DISORDERS, MAKING REGULAR TESTING ADVISABLE IN SOME CASES.

SYMPTOMS INDICATING THE NEED FOR TESTING

BREEDS AT HIGHER RISK

CERTAIN BREEDS SUCH AS GOLDEN RETRIEVERS, DOBERMAN PINSCHERS, AND COCKER SPANIELS SHOW A HIGHER INCIDENCE OF

HYPOTHYROIDISM. REGULAR MONITORING WITH T4 TESTS CAN HELP CATCH THYROID ISSUES EARLY IN THESE PREDISPOSED DOGS.

How is the T4 Test Performed?

THE T4 TEST FOR DOGS INVOLVES A SIMPLE BLOOD DRAW, TYPICALLY PERFORMED BY A VETERINARIAN OR TRAINED TECHNICIAN. THE SAMPLE IS THEN ANALYZED IN A LABORATORY TO DETERMINE THE CONCENTRATION OF THYROXINE.

Preparation for the Test

DURING THE BLOOD DRAW, THE DOG IS GENTLY RESTRAINED TO MINIMIZE STRESS. A SMALL AMOUNT OF BLOOD IS TAKEN FROM A VEIN, COMMONLY IN THE FRONT LEG OR NECK, USING A STERILE NEEDLE AND SYRINGE. THE PROCESS IS QUICK AND MINIMALLY INVASIVE.

Interpreting T4 Test Results

Normal T4 Levels

Factors Affecting Test Accuracy

COMMON THYROID DISORDERS IN DOGS
